

Futurity Competition in the Morgan Breed

In an effort to provide a one-stop reference, AMHA offers the following listing of futurity programs available to Morgan breeders.

mong the definitions of the word "futurity" at dictionary. com is one peculiar to the horse industry: "Also called futurity race. Horse Racing. A race, usually for two-year-olds, in which the entrants are selected long before the race is run, sometimes before the birth of the foal."

In our corner of the business, futurities and similar programs (sweepstakes, galas, breeders cups, classics), with their significant purses of money, usually offer a chance to gain financial returns during the early months or years of a horse's life.

They also represent a chance to promote significant breeding stallions, special broodmares, and breeding programs in general. As AMHA Executive Director Julie Broadway says, "The next 'super sire' or 'grand dam' may appear on the scene at any one of the futurities that take place around the country!"

With this article, to be printed in both the official breed journal and on AMHA's website, the hope is to create a one-stop

reference source for all of the monied programs offered for young stock in the Morgan community.

As Broadway states, "These events are so important and AMHA wants to encourage breeders to showcase their young and upcoming stock. We also hope prospective breeders pay close attention and take note of the wonderful gene pool available—and we hope these events will lead to a resurgence in breeding."

AMHA Director Dini Swanson adds, "Coming from the AMHA Breeders Committee, and a lesson instructor point of view, it is imperative that we have a supply of horses to fill the demand that will be coming in the future for starter horses. The foals we produce today will ensure that we have that quality Morgan horse that we want to pass down to future generations."

For example the champion in 2014 was auction get and won \$12,000. Reserve was not an auction get and won \$3,000. It would have been \$6,000 if that yearling had been an auction get.

Age group(s) eligible for competition: Yearling

Must entrants be sired by nominated stallions? There are two categories—auction get which are the result of a breeding purchased at the Circle J Futurity Stallion Auction or non-auction get which are sired by the same stallions in the auction but not the actual breeding purchased at the auction. Auction get can also be the result of purchasing a mare slot at the auction and then the stallion can be any stallion. Prize money does vary based on whether a yearling is an auction get or a non-auction get. Our next stallion auction is January 31, 2015.
